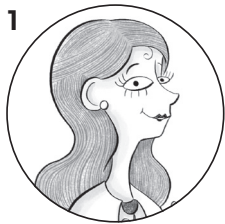


1a Match the people in the story with their descriptions. Draw lines between them.

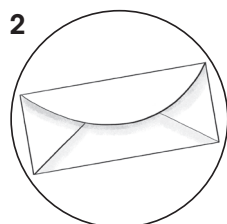

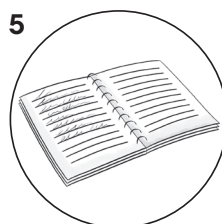
