

Before-reading questions

- 1 **Example answer:** Dublin is the capital city of Ireland, but at the beginning of the 20th century Ireland was part of the United Kingdom, not an independent country. Before Ireland became independent in 1922, fighting began in Dublin in 1916.
- 2 **Reader's own answers.**
- 3 **Example answer:** Most people followed the rules of their religion, so they remained married for life, and didn't have children before they were married. They went to church often, and talked to a priest if they needed help or advice.

During-reading questions

ARABY

- 1 **Example answer:** The boy is probably between 10 and 15 years old. He goes to school on his own and his uncle and aunt allow him to travel across Dublin by train.
- 2 They play in the street and at the back of the houses.
- 3 He is a little in love with her.
- 4 She is going on a trip with the church.
- 5 His uncle gets home late, and he needs to get some money from him.
- 6 He has failed to find anything to buy for Mangan's sister.

EVELINE

- 1 **Example answer:** She has probably lived there all her life. She describes living there when she was young.
- 2 She works in a shop. She doesn't enjoy it because her manager is unkind to her.
- 3 Her father doesn't give her the money quickly.

- 4 She can leave home and go to a new country to get married. Frank is a kind man, who might love her and make her happy. She will be respected and not have to live a sad and difficult life like her mother. She will get away from her violent father.
- 5 **Example answer:** It is a wise decision because life at home is difficult and she is in love with Frank./It is not a wise decision because she doesn't know Frank well and she doesn't really know where she is going.
- 6 **Example answer:** She doesn't go with him because she feels she is needed at home, and leaving is too big a step.

TWO YOUNG GENTLEMEN

- 1 He borrows it from his friends. It is possible he makes money from horse racing.
- 2 She is a servant for a rich family. This means that she can take things from the house and give them to Corley.
- 3 He has a meal, and he walks around Dublin. He meets some friends. He seems bored and doesn't know what to do with the time. He has nowhere to go while he is waiting and he does not have much money.
- 4 He asks his girlfriend to steal it for him, and waits in the street until she gives it to him.
- 5 **Example answer:** Corley and Lenehan are not real gentlemen. They do not behave well towards women.

THE BOARDING HOUSE

- 1 He drank and he attacked her with a knife. A priest gave her a separation from him.
- 2 She wants Polly to help her and to meet the young men in the boarding house. She perhaps hopes that Polly will find a husband there.
- 3 She tells her servant to use the bread from breakfast in the cooking, and she locks the sugar and butter in a cupboard.

- 4** *Example answer:* Mrs Mooney knows that Polly has spent a lot of time with Mr Doran, and people are talking. Perhaps she thinks that Polly is pregnant, or may become pregnant.
- 5** *Example answer:* Polly probably wants to get married. She likes Mr Doran and perhaps she wants to escape from her mother. If she is pregnant, she needs to get married.
- 6** He will lose his job.

A LITTLE CLOUD

- 1** He meets him at Corless's. It is an expensive bar in Dublin. You can drink fine wines and eat oysters and the waiters speak French and German.
- 2** *Example answer:* Gallaher has moved to London and is working there. Little Chandler would like to do something exciting like that, but he has not been able to and he probably never will.
- 3** *Example answer:* Gallaher seems to prefer Paris because it is exciting and sinful. He says that he likes Dublin because it is relaxing and quiet, but he probably prefers excitement.
- 4** Gallaher says he doesn't have time but also he doesn't think highly of Little Chandler.
- 5** Little Chandler has forgotten to bring a packet of coffee. *Example answer:* He feels like a prisoner who can't escape.
- 6** Little Chandler cannot change his future because he is married and has a family.

A PAINFUL CASE

- 1** He lives in Chapelizod. Mr Duffy wants to live a long way from the city centre.
- 2** He meets her at a concert.
- 3** Mr Sinico thinks that Mr Duffy wants to marry his daughter.

- 4** He is afraid that she has fallen in love with him.
- 5** He reads about her death in a newspaper while he is having dinner.
- 6** He feels ashamed of himself because he refused her.

A MOTHER

- 1** He has never organized anything before, and he clearly needs help.
- 2** There aren't many people in the hall.
- 3** It is cancelled so that more people will come on Saturday.
- 4** He comes because Mrs Kearney is worried about the money.

- 6** *Example answer:* Mrs Kearney is right to demand her money, because it was agreed and Kathleen was ready to work./Mrs Kearney is wrong to demand the money, because it is not a good idea for Kathleen's career.

- 2** They are going to the Gresham Hotel, because they live outside Dublin and it would be a cold journey home.
- 3** Gabriel writes for *The Daily Express*, which is not a nationalist newspaper. *Example answer:* Gabriel feels annoyed with Miss Ivors because he doesn't think that writing about books is political. He is perhaps embarrassed that other people heard the argument.
- 4** She is listening to Mr Bartell D'Arcy, who is singing.
- 5** He wants to make love to Gretta.
- 6** She is thinking about a boy she knew when she lived in Galway, and she cries because she is sad that he died.

- 7** He was ill and he got cold. Gretta thinks that she is responsible because he was outside waiting for her.
