During-reading questions**CHAPTER ONE**

- 1 Ellen has had an unhappy marriage to Count Olenski. Now she has left her husband and returned to New York.
- 2 Archer asks May to announce their engagement earlier than they planned. He wants to show New York society that he approves of May's family's behavior.

CHAPTER TWO

- 3 Archer is married to May, but he is still in love with Ellen.

- 1 Mrs. Mingott has had a stroke, maybe because she was so shocked by the news of the Beauforts' problems.
- 2 Archer gets out because he feels very unhappy. He wants to continue his dream of loving Ellen, but she has told him that it is not possible.

CHAPTER TEN

- 1 Archer wants to get some air to make it easier to breathe. He also wants to get away from a difficult conversation with May. She wants him to close the window because it is very cold and she thinks that the cold air will make him ill.
- 2 Ellen is going to live with her grandmother, Mrs. Mingott, to look after her.

CHAPTER ELEVEN

- 1 Archer is planning to leave May, go to Paris to find Ellen, and then travel somewhere with her.
- 2 May tells Archer that she is expecting a baby.

CHAPTER TWELVE

- 1 Archer wants to have some time alone with his son Dallas before Dallas gets married, but he is also afraid of doing new things.
- 2 Dallas has known about Ellen since the day before his mother, May, died. She told him about Archer giving up Ellen for her and their family.
- 3 **Example answer:** Maybe Archer prefers to keep the picture of Ellen as he knew her many years ago. His real life was with May and their children, and he gave up Ellen a long time ago. Maybe he is also afraid of loving her now that it is possible.

After-reading questions

- 1 **Example answer:** The title of the book shows that it is about a time in the past (an "age") when things were different from the present (when the book is being written). It is a time of "innocence" because the characters keep away from unpleasant things or do not talk about them. But often they understand much more than they choose to say.
- 2 *Reader's own answer.*
- 3 **Example answer:** In Chapter One, Archer is embarrassed by Ellen Olenska. He finds her strange and foreign. When he knows her better, he finds her more interesting than the people around him in New York high society. He admires her and thinks that her life is exciting. He falls in love with her, but he knows that the woman that he loves cannot hurt May — her cousin and his wife.
- 4 **Example answer:** Mrs. Mingott likes to be different. She lives a long way up Manhattan, in a different part of New York to her family and most of New York high society. Her house in Newport is also in an unusual place. Mrs. Welland does not like to be different. She wants May and Archer to have a long engagement because that is what most people do. The characters that like to be different, like Mrs. Mingott, are Ellen, Beaufort, and the English Duke of St. Austrey. The characters that do not like to be different, like Mrs. Welland, are Mr. Jackson, Mrs. Archer, Janey, Mr. and Mrs. van der Luyden, Mr. and Mrs. Lovell Mingott, and Mr. Letterblair. Archer sometimes likes to be different, but not always.
