# During-reading questions

### CHAPTER ONE

- They are unhappy because it is too "English" and they do not have a room with a view. Mr Emerson tries to help them. He offers them his son's room and his own, which have views.
- **2** She thinks that he is working class and is showing bad manners.

### CHAPTER TWO

- She is writing a novel about a girl called Leonora who is on holiday there.
- **2** He is worried because George is very unhappy and thinks that things are wrong with the world.

### CHAPTER THREE

- She means that it is easier now for a person to move up from being working class to middle class.
- She wants to visit the Vyses in Rome.
  *Example answer:* She really wants to get away from George.

### CHAPTER FOUR

- A young Italian man and his girlfriend drive the carriage. Mr Beebe thinks about Phaethon and Persephone, who are two young people from old Greek stories.
- **2** George kisses Lucy.

### CHAPTER FIVE

- Cecil thinks Sir Harry Otway is a snob because he does not want to rent his house to "the wrong kind of people".
- **2** He asks her to kiss him but his glasses fall between them.

### CHAPTER SIX

- They are the Emersons, who Lucy met in Florence.
- 2 Lucy had asked the Miss Alans to live in Cissie Villa. She thinks that Cecil has made her look stupid.

### CHAPTER SEVEN

- Miss Bartlett wants Lucy to tell her mother and Cecil about the kiss. The letter has made the secret seem dangerous to Lucy when it was not dangerous before.
- 2 She meets him in the forest while he is swimming naked with Freddy and Mr Beebe.

### CHAPTER EIGHT

- Example answer: It means that Lucy's mother is becoming angry with Cecil just when Lucy needs her to like him the most. Lucy is worried because she has seen George again and does not want to start questioning her decision to marry Cecil.
- 2 Example answer: Lucy does not want to love George, but, when she is with him, she does not want to leave him. She starts to think about him a lot and how beautiful he is.

### CHAPTER NINE

- He is unhappy because the Miss Alans were promised Cissie Villa. He wants to write to them and offer them the house.
- **2** George knows that Miss Bartlett remembers seeing him kiss Lucy.





### CHAPTER TEN

- Miss Bartlett told Eleanor Lavish about George's kiss and this is why she wanted Lucy to tell Cecil. Miss Bartlett was worried that Cecil would learn about it from the book.
- 2 He thinks that Cecil cannot know anyone deeply and that he laughs at people and plays games with them. He thinks that Cecil tells Lucy what to do and she listens to his voice and not her own.

#### CHAPTER ELEVEN

- She is lying to Mr Beebe, the Miss Alans and Mrs Honeychurch about her feelings for George and what she really wants to do.
- 2 Now she does not need to go to Greece to get away from George because he and his father have left Summer Street. She has spent money, made plans and hurt her mother for nothing. It could also mean a waste of her love for George.

#### CHAPTER TWELVE

- He means that George has become unhappy again – like he was before he met Lucy.
- **2** *Example answer:* Maybe because Cecil always liked to be right, and because it makes George normal and easy to love.

### After-reading questions

- At the start of Part Two, Mrs Honeychurch likes Cecil. She thinks he is good and clever, and has beautiful manners. But, after Lucy agrees to marry him, she becomes angry with him for being bored with her neighbour Mrs Butterworth and irritated by many things at Windy Corner. She is not unhappy when Lucy decides not to marry him. Lucy thinks that Cecil is handsome, but she becomes angry with him when he invites the Emersons to rent Cissie Villa. She also questions him not believing in God. Finally, she sees how "terrible" he is when he will not play tennis with Freddy.
- 2 Example answer: George acts on his feelings. He does not think about what he is doing he just does it. Cecil "plans" the kiss because he feels it should happen rather than just wanting it to happen. For this reason, it does not feel right or comfortable.
- 3 Miss Bartlett thought that George worked on the trains. If he works in an office, then he is not as working class as Miss Bartlett thought he was.
- 4 *Example answer:* It may be surprising because her mother did not like Cecil and was not very unhappy when Lucy decided not to marry him. Her mother also seemed to like George. But it may not be surprising because Lucy lied to her mother about George, so her mother was angry.
